## Drivers are now prohibited from:



holding a mobile electronic device



looking at a mobile electronic device unless:

- -viewing navigation &
- -device affixed to vehicle



using a mobile electronic
device unless in hands-free
mode\*

\*operation of a mobile electronic device by which a user engages in a voice communication or receives audio without touching or holding the device; provided, however, that a mobile electronic device may require a single tap or swipe to activate, deactivate or initiate the hands-free mode feature

## **Emergency Defense**

Evidence that the use of a mobile device was in response to an emergency is a defense

For qualifying emergencies, remember: HANDs-free

elp needed (medical)

Accident on roadway


eeds assistance (police, fire, emergency services)


isabled vehicle

## First Responder Exemption

This law does not apply to public safety personnel or emergency first responders using a mobile electronic device while operating an emergency services vehicle and engaged in the performance of their duties

Feb. 23, 2020 Law becomes effective

citations issued for only subsequent offenses and typing or reading of electronic message
